#### **MAJOR CHANGES & KEY INITIATIVES FOR 2022**

- In light of the improvements made to our teaching and learning program during remote learning, a significant portion of curriculum contributions will now be used to fund the school's **technological equipment** and **digital subscriptions** (including online libraries.)
- To support the ongoing monitoring of student progress in both English and Chinese, the school is now investing in new **assessment tools** to gain more accurate data.
- In 2021, APS introduced an extension program for \*Chinese native-speaker students, but significant investment in staffing resources is required to ensure the continuing success of this program.
- The digitalisation of administrative processes and student management through Compass.
- Investment in **Oliver**, a new library and borrowing system for tracking of school assets.
- Enhanced wellbeing support planned for the new Wellbeing Centre, including the Fathering Project.

## PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

### **ONE PAGE OVERVIEW**



### **FREE INSTRUCTION**

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



# **Curriculum Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

# Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

# Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



## FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
